

Baker Sanctuary land clearing update

As reviewed in the October HOA Annual Meeting, the Baker Sanctuary/Travis County Audubon Society (www.travisaudubon.org) received federal funds to create a fire break between the sanctuary and the homes in the Deer Creek HOA. The goal is to reduce the probability of fires by reducing ladder and fine ground fuels. They anticipate that the work will begin around Tuesday, January 22nd and will likely begin on Lime Creek by Canyon Springs.





Edge Zone: 0-30'

- Remove dead trees.
- Remove juniper and live oak < 4" dbh.
- Remove logs on ground < 4" diameter.
- Prune trees to a height of 6' above the ground.

Interior Zone: 30 – 100'

- Same as Edge Zone but trees are pruned to a height of 4' above the ground.

The land clearing crews will access the park located at Zambia and Passionflower Pass with their equipment to gain access to some of the areas behind the homes on Zambia. This is the least evasive to access the area with the minimum effect on the terrain.
